## Schengen visa application form france qatar

France has launched a new service to facilitate all international visa applications. For more information or to register for your visa application documents, sign up for France-Visas, the official visa website for France. France-Visas is the only portal providing all the necessary information to guide you through your visa application and help you at every stage of the process (preparing files, filing and tracking your application). After completing the registration process at France-Visas online, you can continue filing your visa application and collecting your biometric data at the CAPAGO Center. This type of visa is generally issued for tourism, business trips or family visits. It is also issued to persons entering France to take part in short training programmes, traineeships, conferences and company meetings or to engage in remimed activities (whatever form) which do not exceed 90 days. This type of visa is also required for easy transit through France, once outside the international zone at any airport:: If you need to change airports to continue travelling; If you are waiting for a transfer at the hotel or at a friend's home. Uniform Schengen short-stay visa This is a visa issued by a Member State of the Schengen area for transit or stay in a part of the Schengen area or throughout the Schengen area. It may not exceed 90 days for any period of 180 consecutive days. The visa entered in the relevant travel document shall contain the name of the territory in which the holder is entitled to reside. A Member State may request other Member States to consult it after receiving visa applications from nationals of certain third countries or from certain categories of those nationals. A list of the nationalities or categories of nationals concerned is available here: Third countries whose nationals or certain categories of nationals are subject to prior consultation (in French). The visa may be valid for one or more entries. Not all foreign nationals are required to have visas to enter the Schengen area. Exemption from the visa requirement may be granted under different conditions: the nationality of the applicant; If the applicant holds a valid residence permit for the Schengen area; If the applicant holds a long-term residence permit; the special status of a foreign national; foreign nationals who are not required to enter the Schengen area on the basis of their nationality: citizens of the European Union (EU), the European Economic Area (EEA) and Switzerland; Nationals of countries on the Common Schengen List (Annex 2 to Regulation (EC) 2018/1806 (pdf)); Persons entitled to visa-free travel to enter the Schengen area by reason of possession of a residence permit or long-stay visa: holders of a valid residence permit issued by a Schengen State; Holders a residence permit issued by a State of the European Union which bear the designation Membre de famille or Résident de longue durée CE; Holders of a valid long-stay visa issued by the Status of the area; In specific cases, exceptions may be made to the following rules: Example: Journalists seconded from the United States remain subject to the French visa requirement. If you travel to France each year on several short trips, you may be entitled, under certain conditions, to apply for a multiple-entry visa valid anywhere from 6 months to 5 years. This visa is commonly referred to as a circulatory visa. This will allow you to make as many stays as you wish in France, provided that you comply with a cumulative period of 90 days for a period of 180 days, for the duration of its validity. The period of validity is determined by the French administration depending on your situation and the previous visas granted to you. What are the conditions for issuing a circulatory visa? provide evidence of the need or intention to travel frequently; They provided evidence of good will and reliability, in particular through visas previously issued. In all cases, the French administration shall determine whether a circulatory visa may be issued and determine the duration of its validity. What is the procedure for verifying a circulatory visa? If the sticker is marked FRANCE + 1 TRANSIT SCHENGEN, the visa entitles you once to pass through the Schengen State to travel to France; If the mark is FRANCE, the visa only entitles you to enter French territory. If the brand name is FRANCE SAUF CTOM, the visa entitles you to enter France and the territory of the DROM. If the department d'OUTRE MER (FRANCE) mark is valid, you are only entitled to apply for the department(s) listed in the REMARQUES / COMMENTS » section. • DU / FROM » : Date from which you are allowed to enter the Schengen area. • AU / DO » : Date by which you must leave the Schengen area. These two dates determine the period for which your visa can be used (and not the length of stay allowed). TYPE DE VISA / TYPE OF VISA » : Either A: airport transit visa (this visa does not allow to leave the international or duty free zone of the airport) or C: short-stay visa (stay less than 90 days) D: long-stay visa (stay in France for more than 3 months) entitled NOMBRE D'ENTREES / NUMBER OF ENTRIES » : either MULT, which means that you can enter the Schengen area as many times as you want; or 1, which means that you can only enter the Schengen area once; or 2, which means that you can enter the Schengen area twice. • « DUREE DU SEJOUR / DURATION OF STAY » : This is the number of days you can stay in the Schengen area (within the dates of use of your visa) If the consulate has issued you with a de circulation visa (valid for use for one year or more), the number indicated will be 90 jours and you are entitled to stay a maximum of 90 days in each 6 month period. • DELIVRE A / ISSUED IN » : Place of issue of the visa. » LE / ON » : Date of issue of the visa. NUMERO DE PASSEPORT / PASSPORT NUMBER » : Your passport number. • NOM, PRENOM / SURNAME, FIRST NAME » : Surname and forename of the visa holder. • « REMARQUES / NOTES » : Various signs can be stamped here: visa type, category of holder, reason for travel, etc. There is an official online calculator to determine the maximum permitted duration of short stays for foreigners outside Europe in the Schengen area. Reminder: Stays may not exceed 90 days for a given period of 180 consecutive days, regardless of whether the individual is subject to the visa requirement. Please note: The results of this instrument are not legally binding. The French authorities are entitled to process your Schengen visa application in the following circumstances: France is your sole destination for your travels (you can apply for a multiple-entry visa); You travel to different Schengen states, but France is your main destination in terms of length or purpose of stay; You are travelling to different Schengen states, none of which cannot be identified as the main destination, and your first entry into the Schengen area is France (French border station). If you wish to travel to one of these territories and are subject to a visa requirement because of your nationality, you must apply for a special visa because a Schengen visa will not allow you to enter. If your trip involves one of these territories and the European territory of France, you will need to apply for two different visas: a Schengen visa and a national visa valid for the overseas territory or territories to which you wish to travel. Not all foreign nationals are required to have a visa to enter the French overseas territory. Exemption from the visa requirement may be granted under different conditions: the nationality of the applicant; If the applicant holds a residence permit; If the applicant holds a long-term residence permit; Special status of a foreign national. Nationals of the European Union (EU), the European Economic Area (EEA) and Switzerland are entitled to visa-free travel on grounds of nationality; Nationals of countries referred to in orders relating to each territory. Persons entitled to visa-free travel to enter the Overseas Territories by reason of possession of a residence permit or long-stay visa: holders of a valid residence permit issued by the French prefecture or schengen state; holders of a special card issued by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs to diplomatic and consular mission personnel; holders of a valid long-stay visa issued by a Schengen State; Visa-free travel to enter the overseas territories on the basis of nationality, if the applicant is in possession of a visa issued by a French consular authority with multiple entries and if the period of validity is between 6 months and 5 years, may be granted: nationals of South Africa, Bahrain, Belarus, China, the United Arab Emirates, India, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, Russia and Ukraine.
